Adjectives with “ed” vs. “ing”

Part 1: Understanding the Rules

Rule:

- Adjectives ending in “-ed” generally describe emotions or feelings, indicating how a person feels.
 - Example: She was **excited** about the upcoming trip.
- Adjectives ending in “-ing” generally describe something that causes a particular feeling or emotion.
 - Example: The movie was **exciting**.

Examples:

- She felt **bored** during the lecture. (Adjective with “-ed”)
 - The lecture was **boring**. (Adjective with “-ing”)
 - He was **surprised** by the unexpected news. (Adjective with “-ed”)
 - The news was **surprising**. (Adjective with “-ing”)
 - They were **interested** in the new project. (Adjective with “-ed”)
