



Conditionals

Part 1: Understanding the Conditionals

Zero Conditional:

How to form the Zero Conditional:

- Use the simple present tense in both clauses.
- Structure: If + present simple, present simple.
 - Examples:
 - If it rains, the ground gets wet
 - If you heat ice, it melts.
 - If the sun sets, it gets dark.

First Conditional:

How to form the First Conditional:

- Use the simple present tense in the "if" clause and the future simple tense in the main clause.
- Structure: If + present simple, future simple.
 - Examples:
 - If it rains tomorrow, we will stay indoors.
 - If I have time, I will call you.
 - If she studies hard, she will pass the exam.

Second Conditional:

How to form the Second Conditional:

- Use the simple past tense in the "if" clause and the conditional (would + base form) in the main clause.
- Structure: If + past simple, would + base form.
 - Examples:
 - If I won the lottery, I would travel around the world.
 - If I had a car, I would drive to work.
 - If they had more money, they would buy a new house.

Third Conditional:

How to form the Third Conditional:

- Use the past perfect tense in the "if" clause and the conditional perfect (would have + past participle) in the main clause.
- Structure: If + past perfect, would have + past participle.
 - Examples:
 - If he had studied, he would have passed the test.
 - If I had known, I would have come to the party.
 - If she had listened, she wouldn't have made that mistake.
