



Relative Clauses

Understanding Relative Clauses

Explanation:

Relative clauses are used to give additional information about a noun or a pronoun in a sentence. They are introduced by relative pronouns, such as "who," "whom," "whose," "which," and "that."

Examples:

1. The woman who is sitting next to me is my mother.
2. He has a dog that loves to play fetch.
3. This is the book which I was talking about.
4. She has a friend whose father is a doctor.
