



Superlatives

Rules for Forming Superlatives:

Adding "-est":

- For one-syllable adjectives and some two-syllable adjectives, add "-est" to the adjective to form the superlative.
 - Example: high → highest, fast → fastest, big → biggest

Adding "Most":

- For most two-syllable adjectives and multi-syllable adjectives, use "most" before the adjective to form the superlative.
 - Example: interesting → most interesting, modern → most modern

Irregular Superlatives:

- Some adjectives have irregular superlative forms and do not follow the "-est" or "most" pattern.
 - Example: good → best, bad → worst, far → farthest (or furthest)

Exceptions:

- Be aware of irregularities and exceptions. For some adjectives, both forms (adding "-est" or using "most") are acceptable.
 - Example: clever → cleverest or most clever, friendly → friendliest or most friendly

Using "The" before Superlatives:

- Superlatives are usually used with "the" before them.
 - Example: Mount Everest is the highest mountain in the world.
